PEDESTRIANISATION

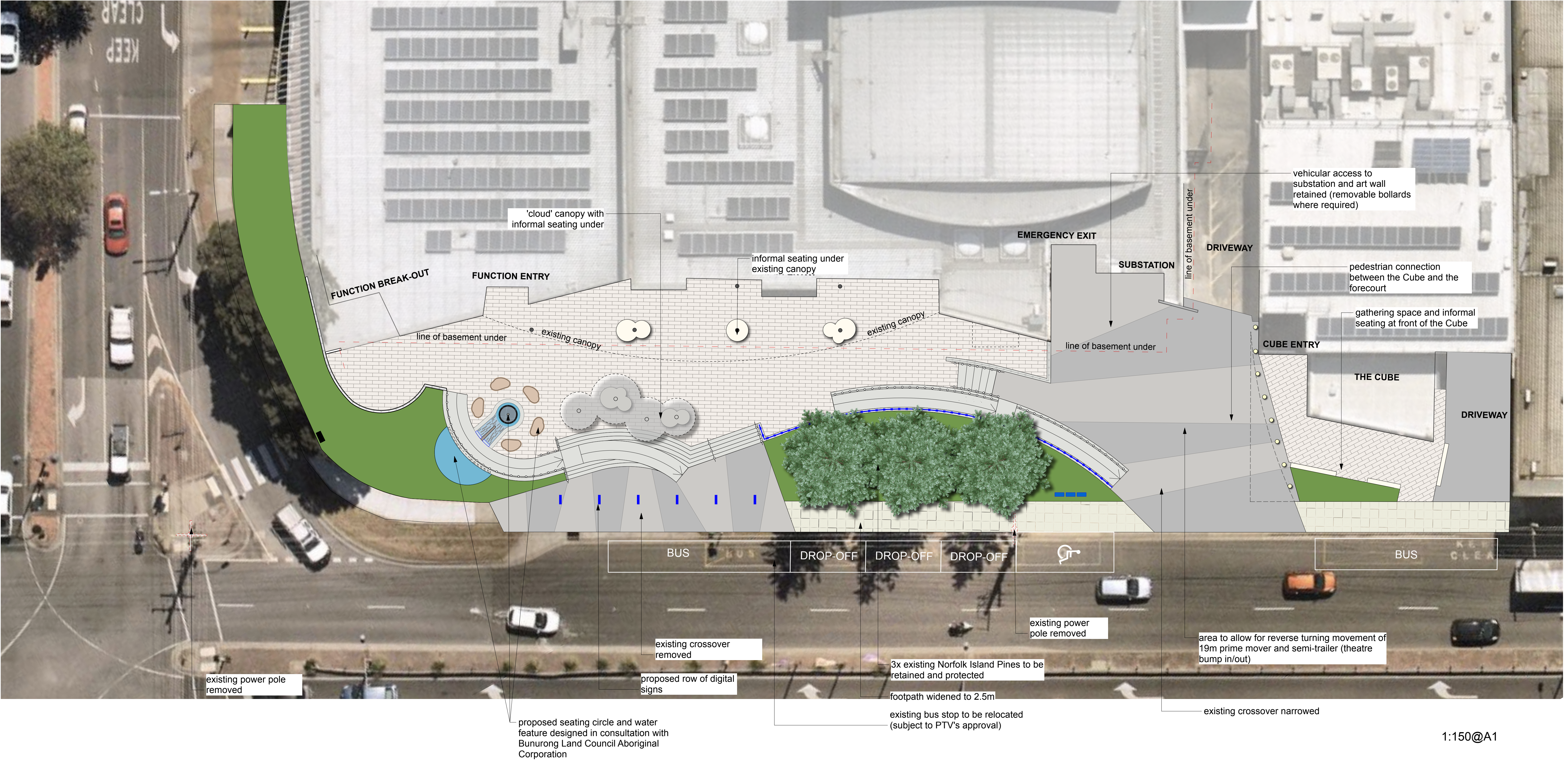
Accessibility is a key consideration in this important community facility. The new design will include:

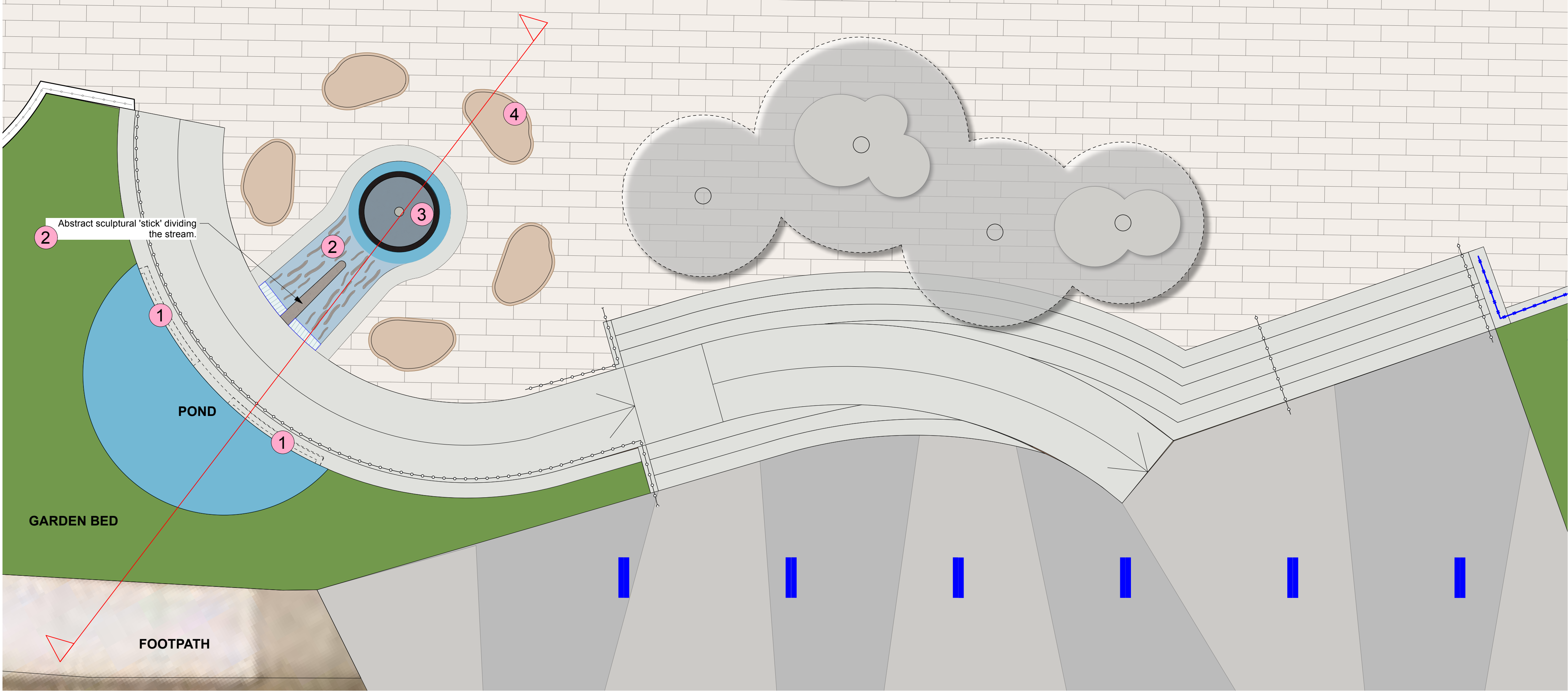
- DDA compliant steps, ramps and handrails

THE CUBE

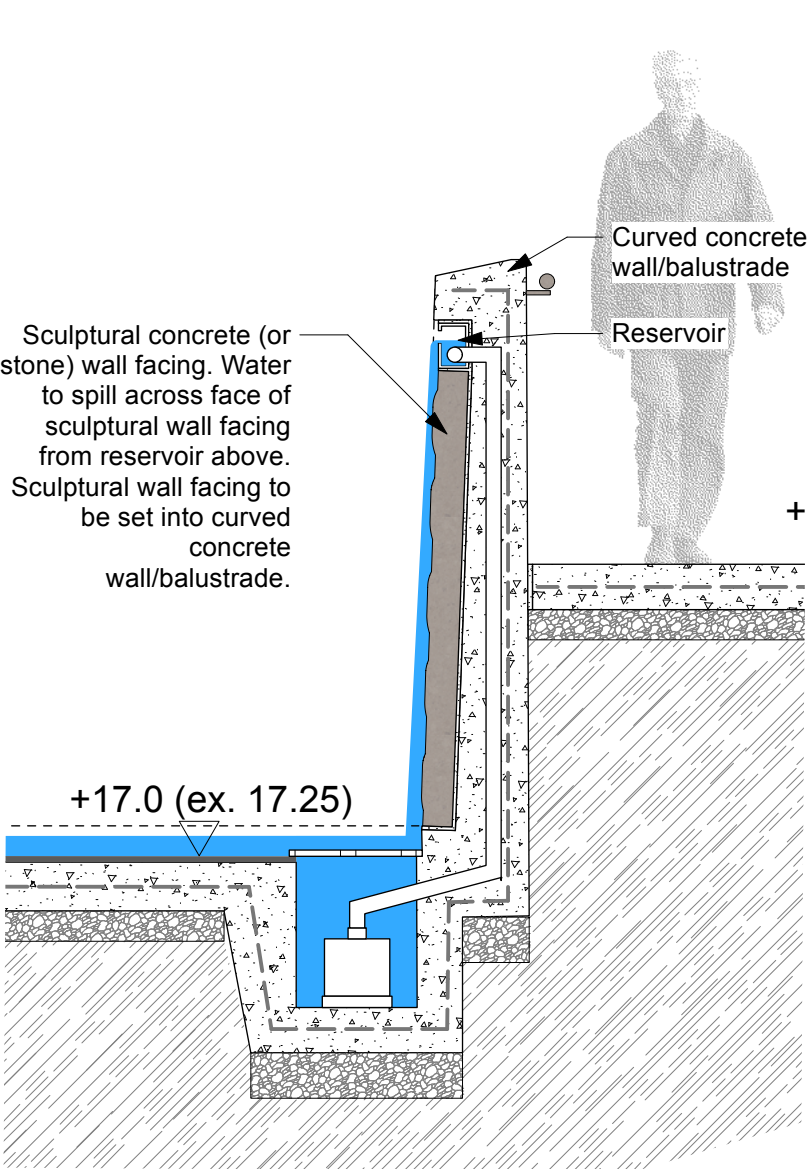
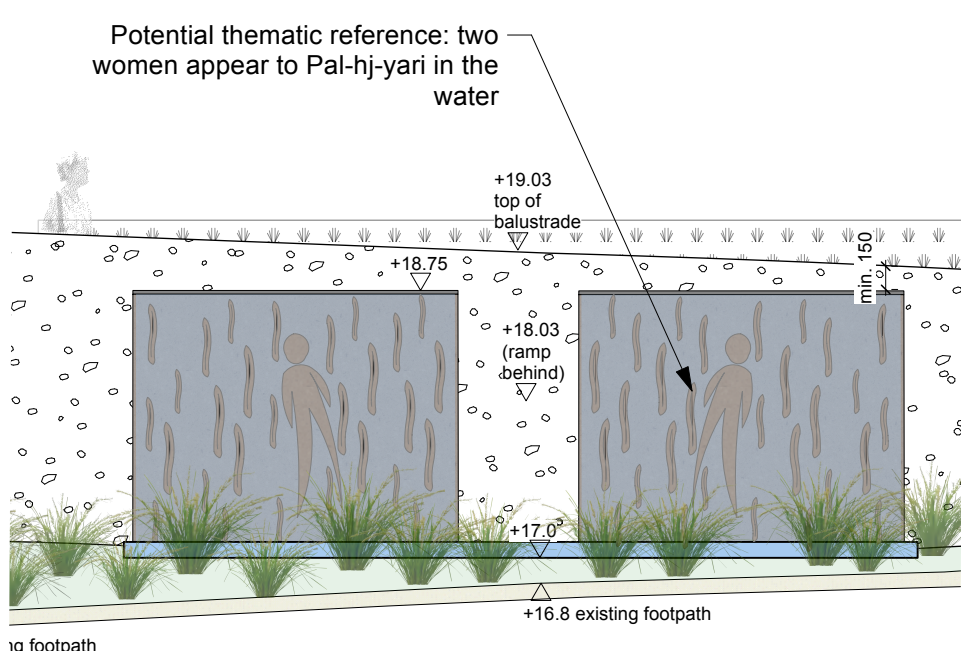
- The forecourt design will provide a strong link between the FAC and the Cube, and will provide a small gathering place for parents/user groups
- Landscaping to the Cube forecourt will maintain and frame views to display space



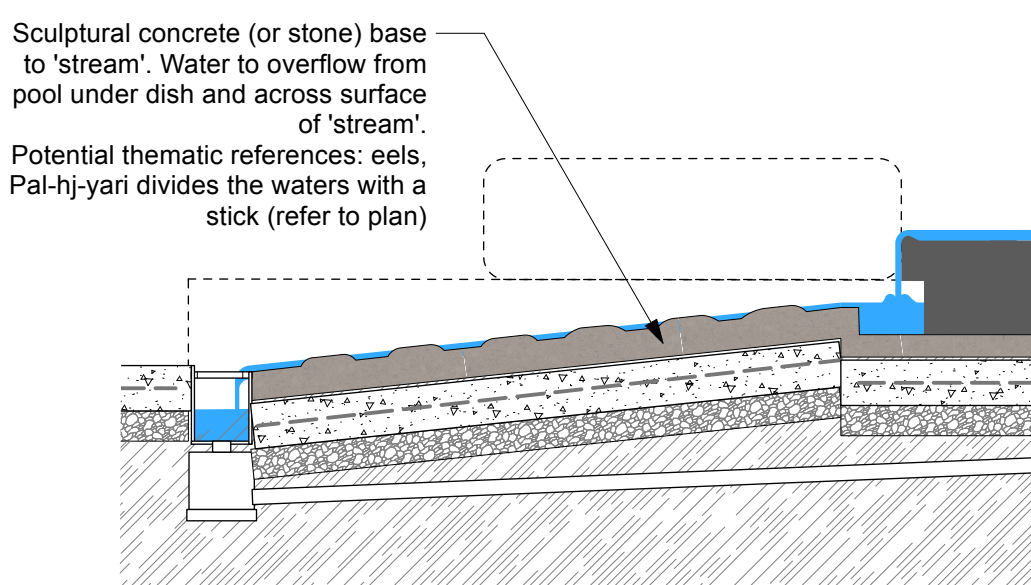
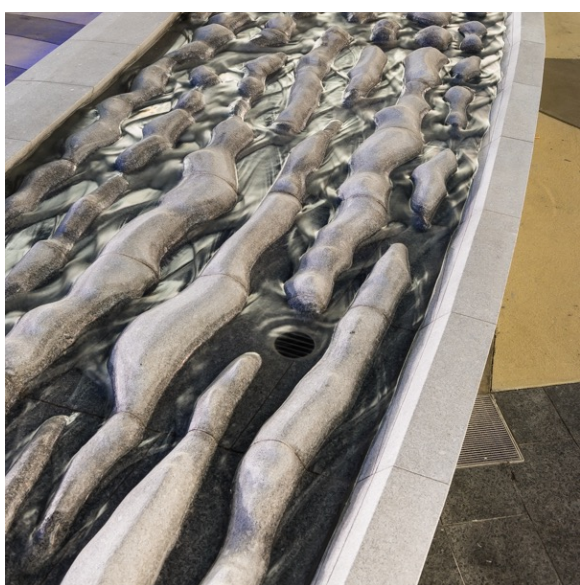




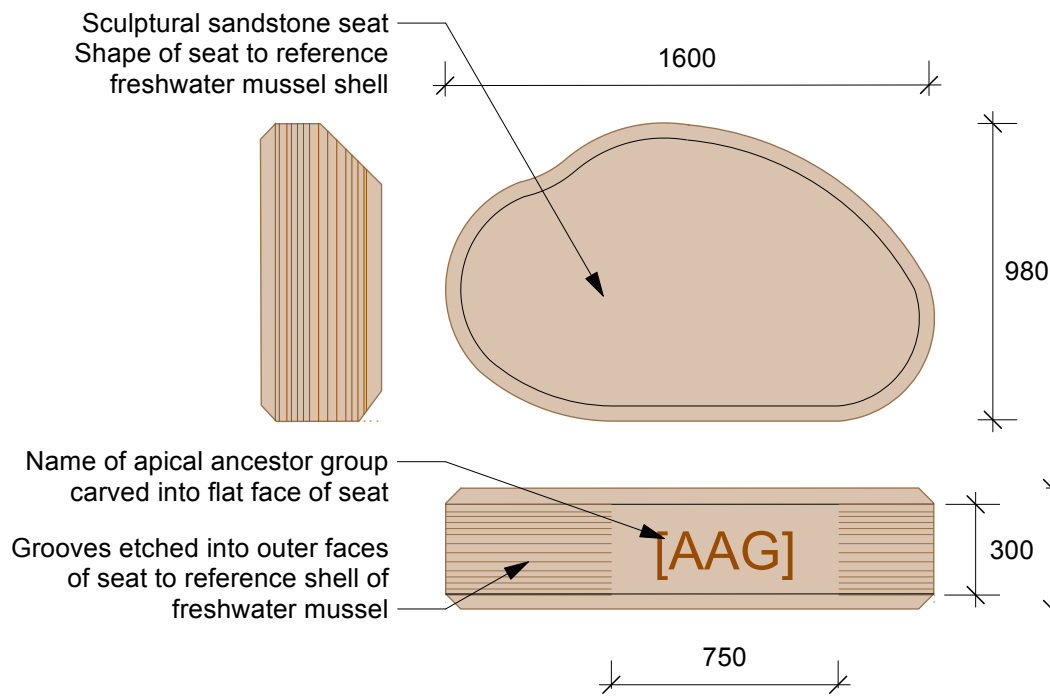
